





#### A LONG PATH TO UNDERSTANDING BIBLE PASSAGE

"I came to cast fire upon the earth; and how I wish it were already kindled!"

— Luke 12:49

Reading the Bible over the years I can definitely say that understanding certain scripture passages have come to me easier than others. I think part of that is because our particular experiences and situations in life lend to us grasping the deeper meaning of specific passages in particular and unique ways - our understanding of the scriptures are in a sense a revelation from God.

For me there's a particular passage that took me upwards of 4 years to understand. Usually when I come to a verse or passage in Scripture that may be challenging, I'll sit with it a few days and if I still haven't grasped the meaning, then I'll reach out to friends or mentors who have a deeper spiritual insight than I do.

With this particular passage, however, I decided to sit with it for a long time. This is probably one of the reasons why this passage is so special to me. The verse comes to us from the Gospel according to Saint Luke, Chapter 12 verse 49 where Jesus Christ is preaching openly to the multitude and, beginning with His disciples, he expounds and lightly touches on a myriad of different spiritual topics. The verse goes as follows, "I came to cast fire upon the earth; and how I wish it were already kindled!"

Well, it wasn't until a few years ago that I was reading a letter by a saint and in her letter she brings this verse up in passing. And I was so amazed that I read it three or four times over and I was just so over joyed at having stumbled upon the meaning of this verse. In a way, it felt like the parable of the lost coin when a women loses a coin and upon finding it rejoices greatly at having found it.

In this letter, the Saint speaks about the importance of the Holy Spirit in the formation of the Christian Life. It is true that our focus is on Jesus Christ, the Son of God, but we cannot forget that it is the Holy Spirit that reveals to us the Son, and the Son that reveals to us the Father.

As a saint has remarked before, "When we have the Spirit, we also have the Son and the Father, and vice versa." But it's important to realize that it is the Holy Spirit Himself that brings about the presence of the Son, Jesus Christ.

And why am I mentioning this? Well, it is precisely in this context that the Saint offers her spiritual understanding of the verse, "I came to cast fire upon the earth." According to this understanding, when Christ says these words, he is referring here to the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. As we hear in the Acts of the Apostles, the Holy Spirit descended upon the Apostles like tongues of fire.

Jesus Christ in this verse is eager to send to His disciples the coming of the Holy Spirit as fire upon the earth. And what is this earth? It is a reference to our bodies, as Christ harkens back to the creation of our ancestors, Adam and Eve. Their bodies were formed from the dust of the earth.

Now here's a slightly deeper understanding. Not only is Christ eager to send down the Holy Spirit (that is the fire) upon our bodies (the earth), He is especially eager to begin the initiation of his disciples into the Christian life through baptism by fire.

Okay, maybe that's a little confusing. Stick with me here for a second. If you remember, in the early chapters of the Gospel of Matthew, we hear St. John the Baptist and Forerunner, a relative to Jesus Christ, and the one who comes before Jesus Christ to proclaim his coming... and St. John the Baptist is baptizing all these people with water in the river Jordan. And of course some of the leaders at the time, the Pharisees, were a little confused as to why he was doing this. And as they approached him he said to them, listen, what I'm doing is a baptism by water for repentance, but soon there will come someone greater than I who will baptize you with the Holy Spirit, and with fire.

St. John here is linking the Spirit and Fire alongside the baptism of Christ and we can link this with when Christ says that He came to cast fire upon the earth – they are directly linked. At Pentecost, Christ's disciples, and more importantly His Church, were baptized by fire, by the Holy Spirit. It is for this reason that our Church is considered a continual Pentecost. And our spiritual life is directly connected with this understanding. This is why baptism is of such importance. It is because we are given the gift of the seal of the Holy Spirit through which we are initiated into the life of Jesus Christ - His death and His resurrection.

So when Christ comes to cast fire upon the earth, just remember that he's not here to set the world on fire, but to bring the Holy Spirit upon the earth of our hearts.

#### Cathedral **Etiquette**

Guidance for parishioner behavior while participating in the Divine Liturgy and

other church services

- 1. If you wear lipstick to Church, please wipe your lips well before kissing an icon or cross, taking Holy Communion, or kissing the Priest's hand.
- 2. We honor Him with our modesty, respect and piety with respectful attire. As the Holy Scripture says, "Holiness befits Your House, O Lord, for evermore." (Psalm 93:5).
- 3. While antidoron is not Holy Communion, it is blessed bread and should be eaten carefully so that crumbs don't fall on the pews or floor.
- 4. Please refrain from talking and socializing during Liturgy in the Church and in the Narthex so we don't distract others from their worship and prayers.
- 5. Please turn off your mobile devices or place on mute before entering the Church.
- 6. Please be respectful and not walk up and down the aisles when the priest is facing the parishioners. When the priest is facing the altar, you may proceed to your seat.

Remember that you are in Church to worship and pray to God. The priest says, "With the fear of God, with faith and love, draw near." Let this be the way you approach your worship.

#### MINISTRY UPDATE

It has been a joy to serve the Holy Trinity Greek Orthodox Cathedral community for the past six months. Presbytera Sarah and I have felt embraced,

loved, and taken care of by everyone we have encountered. At this milestone, which happens to coincide with the beginning of the ecclesiastical year, I thought it appropriate to offer some reflections on the state of the ministries presently entrusted to my spiritual and pastoral care. I have been afforded the opportunity to focus more completely on the ministries that embrace our members in the 20s-40s age range. These include our college ministry the Orthodox Christian Fellowship (OCF), our Young Adult Ministry (YAM), and some of our adult education opportunities for our members seeking to deepen their faith and inquirers looking to learn more about Orthodox

Christianity. In what follows, I will offer a "state of" each of these ministries, including some recent and upcoming events

#### Orthodox Christian Fellowship

The primary vision of Orthodox Christian Fellowship, according to their national office is "to be the loving presence of Christ and the Orthodox Church on college campuses; To be an integral part of students' spiritual formation by challenging them to explore the Faith; and to inspire students to commit to living an Orthodox Christian way of life daily." Our efforts in engaging in OCF is centered on facilitating opportunities for fellowship itself. Through a generous donation, we have been able to sponsor two monthly meetings, free of charge, to college students primarily at UNC Charlotte, while opening it up to students from other area schools. This allows the students to get together regularly, without the burden of cost that some might find prohibitive on limited college budgets. These events include a monthly dinner at a restaurant, an on campus conversation, and fun community building outings. Students

are able to ask questions and learn more about their faith, pray together, and grow as a community. Generally, we have had excellent turn outs—15 to 20 students. We meet the first Thursday and third Tuesday of each month, unless there is a conflict. Our October communitybuilding outing was at Defy Gravity, a trampoline park in Charlotte. We look forward to many more opportunities to gather, including some weekend retreat and possibly attending the national OCF College Conference at the Antiochian Village in Pennsylvania—a gathering of around 300 Orthodox Christians college students of many ethnic jurisdictions. Please let me know if you or your college student(s) would be interested in joining.

I have also made an effort to personally call the students from Holy Trinity who are presently at college near and far. It has been a great joy to hear about their college experiences and connect with them. They have expressed both the joys and challenges of college life. My hope is that in addition to these calls I can plan to visit each school within driving distance where students from Holy Trinity are studying once per semester. I would be glad to bring Orthodox care packages to all of these students—please let me know if you would like to participate in that!

#### Young Adult Ministries (YAM)

I find myself in a unique situation as the spiritual advisor to the YAM. I am at once a member—being myself a young adult—and someone tasked with the pastoral care of this important demographic. I have been humbled and blessed to have encountered some remarkable people in my six months here. There are so many young adults and young professionals that are hungry and thirsty for what the Church and this community in particular has to offer. One of the biggest challenges for many young adults in general is finding meaningful connection in the midst of a busy and uncertain world. The young adults I have engaged with here and throughout my ministry, have said sometimes they feel like outsiders, lonely, or otherwise removed from community life. This is why my vision for YAM is not just to cultivate fellowship amongst peers, but also within the larger Holy Trinity Cathedral community. We are doing this within the existing YAM structure by facilitating connection-making inter-generationally and making a concerted effort to integrate the young adults of Holy Trinity into the larger community.

As part of the YAM structure, we meet as a group twice a month—on the first Tuesday and third Thursday. This allows for consistency in an already busy schedule that most of our young adults keep. Instead of having a closed

gathering for young adults on the first gathering each month, we have decided to incorporate them into an existing adult educational ministry, namely, our book club. I will offer more details about the book club below. For now it suffices to say, it is important that there are opportunities for all of our Cathedral members to learn together about our Orthodox faith in community. Breaking down barriers allows for deeper connection between all of our members.

Our second meeting of each month is an outing to restaurant, fun activity, a museum, etc. This allows for everyone to socialize in a relaxed environment. To further foster connection to the larger community, we will periodically include leaders from other ministries at the outings, so that the young adults can get a better sense of what our community has to offer, while meeting new people. Regularly, at coffee hour we will also have a YAM table set up, where young adults can gather to get to know one another as they also meet the larger community.


We also want to foster connection between the YAM members themselves. In order to accomplish this we will be hosting regular and special gathering throughout the year. These will include a retreat, a Greek Night, volunteer opportunities, and other experiences.

#### **Adult Educational Ministries**

Our Adult Educational Ministry has gone through a few changes in the new Ecclesiastical year. These ministries will be divided amongst Fr. Vasileios and me. Father will offer a Bible study on Thursday evenings and both a women's and a men's group ministry monthly. I will offer a weekly book club in the library on Tuesdays at 7:00 PM—with the exception of the third Tuesday of each month, when I will be with the college students for OCF. This book club is open to everyone. Our text is The Names of Jesus: Discovering the Person of Jesus Christ through Scripture by Fr. Thomas Hopko—and can be purchased at the bookstore!

On Saturday evenings from 6:00 to 7:00 PM in the chapel, we offer a Great Vespers in English followed by a reflection with me and some open conversation. This opportunity is offered for those interested in learning more about their faith and for inquirers interested in learning more about Orthodox Christianity. Each week, I will offer a reflection on a topic related to Orthodox theology, spirituality, history, or practice. Please feel free to email me any questions you would like me to address in one of my reflections. I look forward to seeing you all there!












# In Memoriam

#### **Philip John Forlidas (1929 - 2019)**

Philip John Forlidas, 90, died peacefully on August 31, 2019 at his home in Charlotte, North Carolina. Visitation was at the Holy Trinity Greek Orthodox Cathedral in Charlotte on Wednesday, September 4, 2019 at 10:00 AM, immediately followed by a Trisagion service and funeral at 11:00

Mr. Forlidas was born on January 31, 1929 in Monroe, Louisiana to John Evaggelos Forlidas and Cornelia Pappas Forlidas. After growing up in Shreveport and Baton Rouge, Louisiana, Forlidas attended Natchez High School in Natchez, Mississippi; he graduated from Wofford College and attended graduate school at the University of Georgia.

For five decades Forlidas worked in partnership with his late brother, Angelo Forlidas, as an apartment developer and owner, and as a home builder, built more than 100 houses in the Charlotte-Mecklenburg area. He is a Past President of the Charlotte Home Builders Association, and a past Vice President of the North Carolina State Board of the Home Builders Association. It was during this time that he was appointed by former NC Governor Jim Hunt to an executive committee studying the issue of singlefamily housing finance and to specify what type of legislative action was needed.

A proud member of the Charlotte Greek community, Forlidas was a founding member of the first Holy Trinity Cathedral Foundation. He served two years on the Greek School Board, and was a Past President and fifty-year member of the Order of Ahepa Marathon Chapter, and was a charter member and Secretary of the Order of Ahepa Charitable Trust Foundation.

For 40 years Forlidas was active with the Boy Scouts of America, where he was an assistant scout leader with Troop 164 at Providence Presbyterian Church. Through his dedication to this volunteer position with the scouts he helped more than one hundred boys earn the Eagle Scout Award. For this he was recognized by archdiocese of his church with the Prophet Elias Award in 2008.

Forlidas was also a 32nd degree Scottish Rite Mason and a member of the Oasis temple. He was a member of the Greater Charlotte Apartment Association; he served sixteen years on the board of directors of HOW Insurance Company; he was a member of the Charlotte Regional Commercial Board of Realtors and the American Association of Individual Investors.

He is survived by his wife of 56 years, Betty Jones Forlidas, and three children, John Evans Forlidas, Leigh Anne Forlidas, and Constance Marian






